Brian J. Cano

Since 2002, Brian has officially been a wanderer on a path of adventure and discovery. Having been inspired at an

early age with shows like In Search Of... as well as the movie, Ghostbusters, Brian's paranormal journey found direction with the cable-access-to-web show, SCARED! Evolving from the Skeptic to the Scientist under the SCARED! banner, those early dalliances in urban exploration led him into exploring the many possibilities that existing and emerging technologies offered for paranormal investigation. It was this focus that resulted in his inclusion on the Zaffis family-centered show, Haunted Collector, which ran for three seasons. On the show, Brian was the Tech Specialist, responsible for the implementation and use of all the gadgets and gear. Best known for mixing old and new techniques of investigating, he often found himself doing the physical tasks, such as crawling under houses and up into attics. He also served as second in command of the team and helped to manage the deployment of the crew itself.

Ultimately, his goal as an investigator is to measure, quantify and get empirical evidence to support the claims of paranormal activity reported while maintaining his skeptical edge. "It's not the phenomena I am skeptical about, it's those who report it".

His successful, "The Method" event tour has helped attendees find focus and become better investigators. In his spare time, Brian co-created a paranormal card game called "The Three Pillars" which simulates an investigation and includes many figures in the field on the cards themselves. His work has been praised in several publications, including TAPS Paramagazine and Haunted Times Magazine.

His latest focus has been on spreading "#Paralosophy", a term he coined as a mashup of paranormal and philosophy. "There are a lot of people out there doing the Work now and I'd like them to think more and do less. Really consider the whys before addressing the hows".





Ghost Stories of The King George II Inn

The King George II Inn of Bucks County has a worthy history that dates back 335 years. It has a reputation for fine dining and excellent service, but the most interesting feature is the ghostly presence that walks its dark halls at night. Could the spirits of past guests still be visiting the historic inn that overlooks the Delaware River?

The King George II Inn is America's oldest continuously operating inn. It was founded, along with the town of Bristol, PA in 1681. Originally named "The Ferry House", it was renamed the Fountain House, the Delaware House and finally rebuilt named after King George II of England in 1735. Many dignitaries were guests there, including George Washington, John Adams and James Madison. The inn once served as headquarters in 1776 during the Revolutionary War, and after the revolution it was considered one of the best hotels between Philadelphia and New York City.

But some guests have never left. People have reported seeing one particular ghost wearing a top hat and fancy 19th century style suit and thus have dubbed him the Dancing Ghost. Sometimes a baby can be heard crying deep within the walls of the guest rooms. Two of the workers at the inn have seen apparitions on the Third Floor, but when they approach the figure it disappears. Chairs move on their own, lamps turn on and off, and pictures fly off the walls.

So, be prepared the next time you visit the King George II Inn for a tasty Slow Roasted Prime Rib dinner and Truffle Parmesan French Fries, because you might notice your silverware disappearing and reappearing across the table, or hear the doors slamming in a vacant guest room upstairs. You can always pay your bill and check out of the Inn but as history has proven, it is certain that the ghostly guests won't be leaving any time soon, because after all their eerie presence has been haunting the richly decorated halls for centuries. 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Chuck's Paranormal Adventures

Chuck Lehman (52) is a paranormal investigator, currently located in Monroe, NJ. He is a solo investigator who started investigating in 2010. He started his investigative career at a local cemetery after a challenge issued to skeptics during an episode of the TV show *Ghost Adventures*. On his first investigation, he recorded six possible spirit voices on his audio recorder and has been hooked ever since.

Burlington County Jail Museum (Mt. Holly, NJ)

In addition to investigating famous haunted locations, Chuck also helps out families with private residence investigations when requested. He uses a blend of scientific and metaphysical tools to determine if a location is actually haunted or if natural causes give the the illusion of a haunting.

Chuck also enjoys consulting and working with other paranormal teams when they are in need of assistance on cases.

In addition to investigating the paranormal, Chuck is also involved in energy healing & therapy, due in part to where the paranormal journey has taken him. Chuck is a certified White LIght Reiki Master and uses a Crystal Healing Bed and Crystal Singing Bowls as part of his energy modalities.




<u>Museum of Modern Art, NYC</u> Louise Lawler: WHY PICTURES NOW

April 30, 2017–July 30, 2017

Floor Six, The Joan and Preston Robert Tisch Exhibition WHY PICTURES NOW is the first major survey in New York of the artist Louise Lawler (American, b. 1947), spanning the 40-year creative output of one of the most influential artists working in the fields of image production and institutional critique. The exhibition takes its title from one of Lawler's most iconic works, Why Pictures Now (1982), a black-andwhite photograph showing a matchbook propped up in an ashtray. Reminiscent of an advertising photograph or a film noir still, it asks the viewer to consider why the work takes the form of a picture, and why the artist is making pictures now. Lawler came of age as part of the Pictures Generation, a loosely knit, highly independent group of artists named for an influential exhibition, Pictures, organized in 1977 by art historian Douglas Crimp at Artists Space in New York




















Sheguang Hu NYFW 2017

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
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ARTIST OF THE MONTH

SHRIMP POMODORO

8 jumbo shrimp

1 lb fresh squid ink Linguini or pasta of your choice

2 cups of Red wine

2 cans of whole peeled tomato's

5 Tbls. of Oil

Salt

Pepper

pinch of crushed red pepper

5 Cloves of freshly chopped garlic

3 leaves of fresh basil

Heat a large sautee pan and then add 5 tablespoons of oil, let heat. Add 5 cloves of freshly chopped garlic until golden brown.

When the garlic is ready add a pinch of crushed red pepper then add the shrimp and let cook for 2 minutes each side.

Remove the shrimp from the pan and put them on side. Now with the same sautee pan, add the tomato's and let them cook. While they are cooking, crush them up a little with a fork or tongs and then add 3 pinches of salt, 2 pinches of the black pepper, and a couple leaves of the fresh basil.

When the garlic is ready add a pinch of crushed red pepper then add the shrimp and let them cook for like a minute - minute and a half on each side.

While the tomato's are cooking prepare a pot of water to boil for the pasta (add a little salt to the water). Now prepare 2 cups of wine, 1 is to be added to the tomato's as they're cooking and the other is for you to drink. Iol Stir the sauce and then take the shrimp and put them back in the sauce. By this time the water should be boiling and you can add the pasta to the boiling water and stir. Remember when cooking with fresh pasta that you don't need as much time as you do when you cook dry pasta

The pasta should take no more then 2-3 minutes to cook.

Strain the pasta well and plate it.

Your shrimp sauce should be ready now , remove from heat and place the shrimp evenly on top of the pasta, then pour some sauce on top of the pasta and shrimp. You are now ready to eat and enjoy!!
